

WHO CAN WITNESS?

In order to act as a witness in a candidate's electronic Record of Experience (eRoE) you must be in a position where you can directly observe the performance of the candidate.

You will need to be a GDC registrant and have successfully completed the witness training programme available on the eRoE



WHAT DOES A WITNESS DO?

The role of a witness is to:

- Satisfactorily complete the training
- Directly observe the performance of the candidate
- Make judgements about the performance observed
- Give constructive feedback to the candidate on their performance
- Record their judgements and their feedback on the eRoE platform within **14** days of the clinical activity

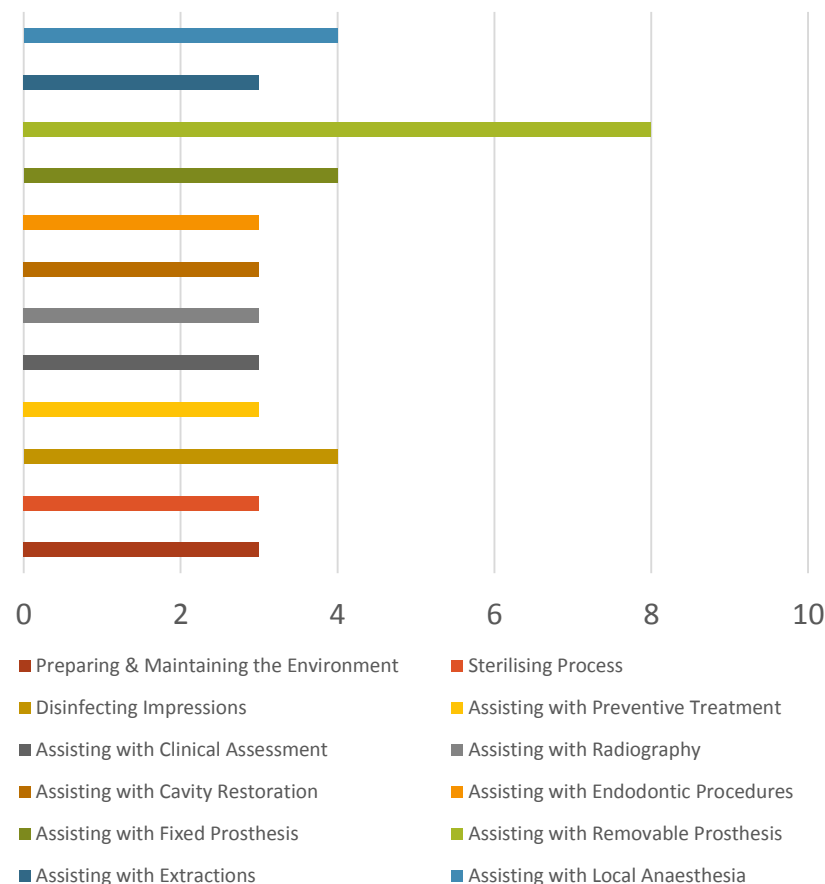


WITNESS TRAINING

- Make their decisions based only on the criteria provided
